Heavy Precipitation Outlook

HOT & DRY TODAY

- Late-summer heat returns to the Front Range Sunday, with afternoon temperatures climbing into the mid to upper 90s. Look for plenty of sunshine today, along with gusty NW winds developing during the afternoon and early-evening hours.
- Dry and subsident NW flow aloft will curb any chance for showers or thunderstorms.
- Mostly clear and mild tonight ahead of a cold front, with temperatures falling into the upper 50s.

STORM RAINFALL POTENTIAL AND DURATION: No precipitation expected today or tonight.

A LOOK AHEAD: A cold front arrives Monday morning, knocking daytime temperatures back into the low to mid 80s. The atmosphere will be relatively stable, but the influx of surface moisture could be enough for a few isolated showers and thunderstorms to form late in the day.
