Flash Flood Prediction Program

ANOTHER COOLER AND DRY DAY TODAY

- Another cooler day today with temperatures slowly reaching the upper 70's for highs today, along with sunny skies and breezy conditions throughout the day as a weak cold front moves over northeastern Colorado late this morning.
- Northwesterly upper level flow will continue to bring in drier air aloft over the District once again limiting any chance for showers or thunderstorms.
- Mostly clear skies this evening along with dry conditions throughout the night as temperatures drop into the mid 50's for overnight lows.

STORM RAINFALL POTENTIAL AND DURATION: No precipitation expected today or this evening.

A LOOK AHEAD: High-pressure will begin to build to our southwest resulting in warmer temperatures Wednesday with highs in the upper 80's to low 90's with dry conditions expected throughout the day. Thursday will continue the pattern with temperatures in the upper 80's to low 90's with a slight chance for an afternoon shower/isolated thunderstorm. High-pressure begins to break down Friday bringing a better chance for afternoon showers/thunderstorms with good chance for moderate to localized heavy rain with a slight chance for showers to linger overnight into Saturday.
