ANOTHER UNSEASONABLY WARM AND DRY DAY

- Another unseasonably warm and dry day across the District as high pressure strengthens over the central plains. Temperatures this afternoon will top out in the mid to upper 80's over the plains. Normal high for Denver today is 75 degrees.
- Winds will be a little breezy at times over southern and eastern areas of the District from the S/SE this morning and S to SW this afternoon in the 5-15mph range with gusts to 20mph or more possible.
- There will be a build up of clouds this afternoon over the higher terrain to the west which may produce a few showers for mountainous areas of the state but the plains will remain dry.

STORM RAINFALL POTENTIAL AND DURATION: No meaningful precipitation today or tonight.

A LOOK AHEAD: A low pressure system will move in from the SW on Friday likely resulting in isolated to widely scattered rain showers and weak thunderstorms in the afternoon and evening. Overnight Friday scattered rain showers will continue likely with best chances for wetting rains over the northern half of the District. Temperatures Friday will be cooler in the 70's over the plains with 60's in the foothills.
