

## **Heavy Precipitation Outlook**

Flash Flood Prediction Program

## HOT AND DRY TODAY

- A surge of low level moisture overnight has resulted in cooler temperatures and cloudy skies over the District this morning. As the low level clouds erode, sunny skies will finish out the day as high pressure begins to build over the region leading to hot temperatures in the low 90's with calm winds and dry conditions expected throughout the day.
- Tonight conditions will remain dry over the District with overnight lows temperatures dropping into the low to mid 60's.

STORM RAINFALL POTENTIAL AND DURATION: No meaningful precipitation expected today or tonight.

A LOOK AHEAD: High pressure continues to build Monday resulting in another hot day with high temperatures expected in the mid to upper 90's with dry conditions throughout the day. Tuesday will start off similar with high temperatures reaching the low 90's once again before high pressure begins to break down bringing a more unsettled weather pattern Tuesday evening through Thursday.
