Heavy Precipitation Outlook

DRY WITH SEASONAL TEMPERATURES

- A dry westerly flow aloft will result in another nice day across the District with mostly sunny skies and temperatures close to seasonal averages for mid September.
- Highs today will peak in the upper 70s to near 80 on the plains. In the foothills, highs will reach the upper 60s to near 70.
- Skies will remain mostly clear tonight with overnight lows in the low 50s on the plains.

STORM RAINFALL POTENTIAL AND DURATION: No rainfall is expected today or tonight.

A LOOK AHEAD: Dry conditions will continue through the weekend, but temperatures will warm up significantly as high pressure strengthens over Colorado with highs approaching 90 on the plains Sunday. Flow aloft will become southwesterly on Monday and Tuesday ahead of a weakening trough of low pressure. As a result, we could see some isolated high-based showers or thunderstorms over the higher terrain Monday and Tuesday, while the plains look to stay generally dry at this time.
