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## Heavy Precipitation Outlook

### Flash Flood Prediction Program

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#### HOT AND GENERALLY DRY PLAINS

- High pressure will continue to strengthen over Eastern Colorado today, resulting in hot and generally dry conditions with highs in the upper 80s to low 90s on the plains.
- Some upper level moisture will arrive from the southwest today, leading to increasing high-level clouds this afternoon. A stray late afternoon/evening shower or weak thunderstorm can't entirely be ruled out over the foothills, but any rainfall will be minimal. Conditions will remain dry on the plains.
- Lows tonight will fall into the upper 50s on the plains under partly cloudy skies.

**STORM RAINFALL POTENTIAL AND DURATION:** A stray shower or weak thunderstorm in the foothills could produce rainfall of TR-0.05". No rainfall is expected on the plains.

**A LOOK AHEAD:** A shortwave disturbance will arrive on Monday ahead of an advancing trough of low pressure from the west. As a result, isolated showers and thunderstorms will develop Monday afternoon favoring the foothills, but moisture will be limited so heavy rainfall is not expected. Tuesday will feature similar conditions as the trough weakens and lifts north of Colorado, with isolated afternoon showers/thunderstorms favoring the foothills and only light rainfall expected. Wednesday will see drier conditions return to the District.
