Heavy Precipitation Outlook

CONTINUED HOT AND DRY

- High pressure over Colorado will result in hot and dry conditions again across the District today. Highs will peak in the upper 90s on the plains.
- Mostly sunny skies early will give way to a mix of sun and high-level clouds this afternoon. Winds will generally be light out of the east/northeast.
- Skies will remain partly cloudy during the overnight period with lows in the low to mid 60s on the plains.

STORM RAINFALL POTENTIAL AND DURATION: No rainfall is expected today or tonight.

A LOOK AHEAD: A subtle increase in moisture from the south on Tuesday will result in some isolated high-based thunderstorms, mainly over the foothills and Palmer Divide. A cold front will arrive Tuesday night, which could lead to some late evening and overnight showers and weak thunderstorms, but heavy rainfall is not anticipated at this time. Low level moisture will increase behind the front on Wednesday, resulting in a good chance of afternoon thunderstorms with heavy rainfall possible. Temperatures will be hot again in the 90s on Tuesday before cooling off into the 80s on Wednesday.
