## **Heavy Precipitation Outlook**

## **COOLER AND DRY TODAY**

- A cold front moved in overnight resulting in cooler morning temperatures as highs reach the low 80's today with mostly sunny skies throughout the day.
- Westerly upper level flow aloft will continue to bring in drier air over the region limiting any chances for showers or thunderstorms.
- Mostly clear skies this evening along with dry conditions throughout the night as temperatures drop into the mid 50's for overnight lows.

STORM RAINFALL POTENTIAL AND DURATION: No precipitation expected today or this evening.

**A LOOK AHEAD:** Similar conditions in store for Tuesday with mostly sunny skies along with dry conditions expected throughout the day and into Wednesday. Temperatures Tuesday will remain in the low 80's with high pressure building back over the region Wednesday bringing warmer and even drier conditions with temperatures jumping back into the upper 80's to low 90's. Thursday, high-pressure will break down slightly as temperatures remain hot in the low to mid 90's with a slight chance for an afternoon shower/isolated thunderstorm, although conditions will favor high-based storm development at this time.
