WARM TODAY WITH DRY CONDITIONS

- Another beautiful day in store for the Front Range as westerly upper level flow continues to dominate over the region resulting in warm temperatures and dry conditions throughout the day.
- Temperatures today are expected to climb into the lower 80's for highs along the plains, with mid to upper 70's in the foothills.
- A mild night tonight with overnight lows expected in the upper 40's to low 50's.

STORM RAINFALL POTENTIAL AND DURATION: No rainfall expected today or this evening.

A LOOK AHEAD: Continued westerly upper level flow will bring another warm day Tuesday with highs expected in the low to mid 80's with dry conditions through most of the week. A weak disturbance will move through Wednesday lowering high temperatures slightly into the upper 70's to low 80's, before another warm up Thursday with high temperatures in the low to mid 80's. A cold front will move through Friday bringing cooler temperatures int he low 70's along with an increase in moisture resulting in a chance for afternoon/evening rain showers/isolated thunderstorms.
